

Guidelines on non-compliance with Continuous Professional Development (CPD) requirements

Teachers who have not complied with the CPD requirements will no longer be listed as YS-registered teachers or covered by insurance. Yoga Scotland's Board of Trustees has the discretion to consider any cases of non-compliance on an individual basis.

Teachers with **up to** five years non-compliance will be readmitted, and insured, on the understanding that they undertake to make up the missed training as follows. These totals are inclusive of the current requirement, for each year, of 15 points.

Non compliance for 1 year

The teacher must accrue 20 CPD points in year of readmission.

Non compliance for 2 years

The teacher must accrue 20 CPD points in each of the two years following readmission.

Non compliance for 3 years

The teacher must accrue 25 CPD points in year of readmission and 20 points the following year.

Non compliance for 4 – 5 years

The teacher must accrue 30 points on year of readmission and 20 points the following year.

Teachers with more than five years without CPD training will be treated on an individual basis, taking into account:

- the number of years of non-compliance
- attendance at regular yoga classes during this period
- attendance at other yoga events
- continuing personal practice
- if yoga teaching has continued during this period

The teacher may then be required to:

- undertake an External Teaching Practice assessment
- attend specific OGT days
- attend specific days/lectures on a Teacher Training course
- provide a reference from a regular class teacher
- submit class plan(s)/essay
- shadow a recognised Yoga Scotland or British Wheel of Yoga teacher

A £35 administration charge will be made on readmission of teachers with more than 5 years missed training. Additional costs for any of the above requirements, such as External Teaching Practice (ETP) will be the responsibility of the teacher in question.
